Skilful Varsity outlast Americans

AFTER early shocks
Oxford University's
superior skills proved
far too much for the
enthusiasm and physique of University of
California, Los Angeles,
who lost for the first
time on their fourmatch tour 33—13 at
Iffley Road yesterday.

The Dark blues, not yet a day back from winning both games on a short tour in the South of France, were somewhat jaded at the start and perhaps apprehensive at taking on a pack of "giants."

Piled up

The Americans, who included three members of the national team, the Eagles, arrived with good wins over an Invitation XV at Osterley Park and Cwmbran.

As the points piled up, American heads dropped, their heavyweight pack tired noticeably and tactics generally were faulty with chances wasted. Long torpedo passes whizzed across the field and found their target, but were largely wasted.

UCLA took the lead after 22 minutes when

scrum half Kim Johannson gave a long, onehanded pass to winger Del Chipman on the blind side and he raced in. Full back Rob Duncanson converted.

The Dark Blues drew level when Eddie Quist-Arcton won the race for a diving touchdown after a clever chip by Roy Hoolan. Tony Watkinson kicked a splendid goal from the touchline.

Exchanges were not too friendly and at one stage referee Tony Fisher took aside the Oxford halves and full back with skipper Watkinson in attendance.

Oxford went ahead when Chris Bray tapped the ball over the line and dived to touch down. Again Watkinson converted from the touchline.

Seven minutes into the second half UCLA paid the

full penalty for a blatant obstruction as Watkinson pegged them back with a long-range penalty.

The Americans had no answer at all to dazzling switch play which brought Oxford's next try. Full back Ken Hopkins was in support to take a scoring pass from Ouist-Arcton.

Then Oxford's full back gathered a kick through at his own 22, burst between two Americans and sped away on the right wing, slipping an inside pass to put over Hoolahan.

Oxford pressed on, Steve Faktor breaking round the blind side of a scrum and through two tackles to go over, and finally Reg Clark went in from a pass by Hoolahan. Watkinson kicked one more conversion.

The game was safe and in injury time (Bray went off with a broken nose after 41 minutes) when UCLA in a late rally scored a dropped goal by Gray from a free kick and a try by Mike Molina




